MAPLE 8 MAKES A DIFFERENCE IN KIMBALL COUNTY

Words cannot describe how thankful we are for everything AmeriCorps NCCC team Maple 8 did for our community. We enjoyed getting to know the team and it is difficult knowing they won't be living in Bushnell anymore.

While the team was here, they completed so many projects that will help each of the sponsor groups well into the future. At the Plains Historical Society, the team documented and organized three rooms worth of artifacts, cleaned the Fraternal Hall and old Kimball High School building from top to bottom, set up new surveillance at both locations, placed antique farm equipment on blocks to be painted, did oral history interviews with locals, and so much more. The work they did has significantly assisted in prepping the museum locations for the upcoming Smithsonian Exhibit, Crossroads: Change in Rural America, which will be at the Fraternal Hall in September.

When the team worked with the Kimball Community Walking Trail, they stained the picnic shelter, pulled weeds, mulched and watered trees, built a picnic table, and built a shelter over one of the memorial benches at the trail. The Kimball Area Foundation Fund has been working on the trail project for a few years now and the work the team did has helped them to be just a few steps away from completion of their project.



Maple 8 built a picnic table, built flower planter boxes (and filled them with beautiful flowers!!), worked on a grain bin picnic shelter, and toured around the area with me so that I could get more photos for future promotional material. It was a pleasure to show off many of our unique attractions, including the High Point and Tri-State Marker, a buffalo tour at Rocky Hollow Buffalo Company, a look at the short grass prairie with Shaun Evertson's Prairie Adventure Tours, and Duckpin Bowling and Tin Roof Sundaes in Potter. We also had a great time fishing and making supper over a campfire at Oliver Reservoir.

Thank you again to everyone who helped out with these projects and to the community for being so inviting. I appreciate the City of Kimball giving the


WONDERFUL VISITORS!

the top of Nebraska. What a joy it was to meet them and share in their enthusiasm for life!




