

PLAINS HISTORICAL SOCIETY ANNUAL MEETING



The Plains Historical Society held their annual meeting at the Fraternal Hall downtown Kimball on February 20, 2020. After the meeting, they introduced Lyn Messersmith and Deb Carpenter-

Nolting as entertainment for the evening. Lyn and Deb recited poems and songs about the "Leaders and Legends of the West". The perfomance was filled with history, just like the Fraternal Hall.

The Fraternal Hall was built in 1904 as a hall for social gatherings in the community. It later became the lodge for The Order Knights of Pythias then was sold by the Knights to the Museum board. The building is currently on the National Historic Register.



The Plains Historical Society was started in 1957. Their name was chosen because the originators wished to take in the trade territory adjacent to Kimball County; namely northern Colorado, Banner County, and eastern Wyoming. The Fraternal Hall has a variety of displays, including the vast collections of O.E. Forsling's Indian artifacts, one of the finest in existence, that was the museum's first major acquistion. The Plains Historical Society is also working to renovate the former Kimball High School Building to house displays. The board and other volunteers have been acquiring historical items to be placed on the acreage at the old school as well.

POTTER SUNDRY SEEKING STATE RECOGNITION



The Potter Sundry in Potter, Nebraska, is hoping that the state will soon name the famous Tin Roof Sundae the official sundae of Nebraska.

The Potter Sundry was originally opened in 1914. James Earl Thayer, the pharmacist at the time, had a son named Harold Dean "Pinky" Thayer, who worked behind the soda fountain and was well known for creating crazy concoctions to delight the customers. Pinky's biggest hit was the Tin Roof Sundae. He named the sundae for the tin ceiling which still exists at the Potter Sundry.

The Tin Roof Sundae is vanilla ice cream almost to the top of the glass, then a generous amount of chocolate syrup, then

chocolate ice cream, and smothered with marshmallow crème until over-flowing and then sprinkled with Spanish peanuts.

If you haven't been to the Potter Sundry to try a Tin Roof Sundae, I highly recommend that you do, especially with it possibly being named the official sundae of Nebraska!
