WONDERFUL VISITORS!



OLIVER RESERVOIR

Last month, we saw a surge of visitors to Oliver Reservoir here in Kimball County. The South Platte Natural Resources District, which owns and operates Oliver Reservoir, sent me a report on registrations and where people had travelled from. There were 1,115 guests from May 19 – June 22 who registered, this didn't include all of the people who came just for day use. Out of that number, 421 were from Nebraska, 354 from Wyoming, 224 from Colorado, and the rest came from all over. Four people came from Germany, others were from Texas, Tennessee, Iowa, South Dakota, Indiana, Connecticut, Illinois, Florida, Alaska, California, North Carolina, Missouri, Minnesota, Alabama, Michigan, South Carolina, Oregon, Wisconsin, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Ohio, New York, New Hampshire, Maryland, Oklahoma, and Washington.

What a great mix of state representation! I love that our little corner of the world can be visited by so many wonderful people. The oasis that Oliver Reservoir is in the high plains of Nebraska has definitely been found out. We hope to continue being able to welcome travlers from the far reaches of the USA and the world and show them a little bit more of what Nebraska is all about!




