Updates on our AmeriCorps NCCC team: It ended up that Oak 1 was not able to come to Nebraska, but Maple 8 was able to fit Nebraska into their plans and have been rocking their work at the Plains Historical Society!

They have been taking inventory of artifacts that had been in storage, and are now creating displays with these pieces in the former high school building. They will have an open house at that location, 816 E 3rd St, June 4th from 3-5:30 pm if you would like to stop by and see all the progress they made.

The team also worked to get multiple rooms cleaned to make space for the new displays, did spring cleaning at the Fraternal Hall for it to be ready for summer visitors, and also worked prepping the Fraternal Hall for the Smithsonian Exhibit coming in September.



June 1st they will have the honor of meeting Nebraska Congressman Adrian Smith and giving him a personal tour of the Plains Historical Society museum and telling him about the amazing program that AmeriCorps NCCC is and all the benefits of being a part of something that helps so many places across the country.

The team will work with the Kimball Community Walking Trail starting

the 7th helping plant, water, and mulch trees, as well as working on a donor wall plaque, memorial benches, building a bench shelter, and helping build a picnic table to be placed at the trail.



From the 14th-25th, Maple 8 will work at the Visitor Center assisting with promotional materials, such as digital stories of area, as well as building at grain bin shelter and a picnic table. I am excited to take them around to different places that are unique to the area as well as letting them experience some of the incredible tours that are offered here, such as feeding buffalo at the Rocky Hollow Buffalo Ranch, and viewing birds, wildflowers, and the short grass prairie at the historic EJE Ranch.

We are thankful for all the volunteers who are taking time to work with the team, as well as local businesses who are

assisting with projects and making the team feel right at home! We couldn't make everything happen if it wasn't for the great community we are a part of!!!



TRI-STATE MARKER

The work to create a walking trail to the Tri-State Marker is underway! Kimball (NE), Laramie (WY), and Weld (CO) Counties have been working together with the land owner to plan how to

allow visitors onto the property to see the marker without continuing to damage the pasture with vehicle traffic.

A walking trail will allow people to get some fresh air and see the beauty of the high plains firsthand. There will be a new parking area as well as increased signage from Pine Bluffs, WY and from Bushnell, NE.



CITIZENS' INSTITUTE ON RURAL DESIGN

In its ongoing support of rural communities, the National Endowment for the Arts, in partnership with the Housing Assistance Council, announces the 2021 communities taking part in its national initiative, the Citizens' Institute on Rural Design. Kimball County is one of 15 communities selected for the Design Learning Cohort in which leaders participate in peer learning. This includes training in design, planning, community engagement, and facilitation techniques; one-on-one technical assistance on their community design challenge; and support in navigating funding opportunities.

"Design is a powerful tool to leverage local assets and celebrate culture, ultimately fostering a strong sense of place," said Arts Endowment Director of Design and Creative Placemaking Jen Hughes. "As rural America recovers from the global pandemic, the Citizens' Institute on Rural Design stands ready to support the bold visions that communities like Kimball County have put forth to guide their future development."

Since 1991, the Citizens' Institute on Rural Design has worked in communities with populations of 50,000 or less to enhance quality of life and economic vitality through planning, design, and creative placemaking. To date, the Arts Endowment has engaged more than 100 communities in all regions of the country.

We couldn't be more excited to be a part of this Design Learning Cohort! We are looking to create community spaces, rethink our 'main street', work on community engagement, and find ways to fund all the projects we are planning for Bushnell, Kimball, and Dix. 
WONDERFUL VISITORS!

NEW TRAVEL GUIDE!




