


percolation into the ground.

They also had a variety of vendors on site so we could sample wine, bison jerky, hard cider, and other products. Finally, we ventured over to Prairie Pride Brewing. There were more beer samplings as well as protein bar samples made with hamburger, blueberries, and cabbage. It was a great time and we enjoyed being able to see what not only downtown Grand Island has to offer, but what other Nebraska vendors are doing

across the state.

On Thursday night, we had a delightful dinner at the awards banquet at the Liederkranz. The Liederkranz Club was founded on November 7, 1870. It presently has the distinction of being the oldest club in Grand Island. It was organized as a singing society to promote singing, music, drama, art, and literature. ### REMEMBRANCE RUG

Kimball is honored to house a unique tapestry, titled the Remembrance Rug. It is a latch-hook rug that was started in December 2003 to pay tribute to those killed in Operation Iraqi Freedom and elsewhere. It is now over 1,000 sq ft and 250 feet in length. The assembler, Rodger Asai, has spent over 15,000 hours so far making the Remembrance Rug and used 4.7 million pieces of yarn creating symbols for each person represented on the tapestry. He has about 6 dozen binders containing the names and background information of the people represented. If you are interested in seeing the Remembrance Rug for yourself, it is housed downtown Kimball at 123 S Chestnut St.
